INFORMATION ON INVITING FAMILY MEMBERS TO VISIT THE UNITED STATES

If family members would like to visit you in the U.S. for a short period of time, they should follow the procedures outlined by the U.S. embassy or consulate in their home country. For a list of U.S. embassy and consulate websites, please refer to: <http://www.usembassy.gov/>

You may also provide your relatives with additional information to assist them in their visa interview.

Documents that may be helpful include:

- An invitation letter
- Copies of your I-20, passport, visa and I-94
- A Colorado State University enrollment verification certificate, which you can order through RAMweb
- Commencement ceremony information: <http://commencement.colostate.edu>

For the actual tourist visa application, your family member will need to show that they have the funds to support themselves during their stay in the U.S.

They will also need to explain their ties to their home country. As the tourist visa is a non-immigrant visa, they will need to be prepared to demonstrate their intentions to return home after their short stay in the U.S. Some of the documents that may be used by applicants to support their intent to return home after their visit may include:

- Proof of a job / employment
- Property or land ownership
- Personal / familial obligations
- Itinerary for their visit to the United States
